As part of a recent Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) session, our Year 11 students participated in a special car safety workshop. The presentation helped highlight the responsibilities of passengers, at a time when students may travel with newly qualified drivers. The influential monologue powerfully communicated some very important key messages, along with the potential risks of getting into a car with an inexperienced driver. The session spent time

examining the importance of wearing seatbelts and not distracting the driver, along with making the decision not to travel with a driver who is, or is potentially, under the influence of alcohol or drugs. We are sure that the content of the session will influence students' future decisions, whether as a driver or a passenger.
