### **District Cross-Country Championships 2023**

Last week, our CCHS Cross-Country team travelled to the new Colchester Northern Gateway sports ground, for this year's annual District Cross-Country Championships. After a number of years when the runners have had to contend with wind and rain, this year the conditions were favourable. The going was still a little soft after the weeks of rain but the saturated ground did not cause too many problems for the competitors.

In their first competitive cross-country race, the Year 7 girls and boys excelled themselves – in the boys' race Max finished 15<sup>th</sup>, Ashton 20<sup>th</sup>, Kareem 47<sup>th</sup>, Harry 50<sup>th</sup>, followed by Jack and Josh. Whilst in the girls' race, Karina was placed 14<sup>th</sup>, Ramona 48<sup>th</sup>, Mia 50<sup>th</sup>, Freya 60<sup>th</sup>, followed by Ava and





Mary. In each race the first four competitors to finish from each school count towards the team result – the Year 7 girls were placed 11<sup>th</sup>, with the boys producing our best team result of the day finishing in 6<sup>th</sup> position. In the Under 14 (Year 8 & 9) events our boys finished with Tom in 50<sup>th</sup>, Michael 55<sup>th</sup>, Archie 58<sup>th</sup> and Jake 62<sup>nd</sup>, followed by George and Oliver. Their combined results (top 4 finishers) put the Under 14 boys' team in 13<sup>th</sup> overall, with the girls finishing in a credible 12<sup>th</sup> position overall – Imogen 20<sup>th</sup>, Kaylin 38<sup>th</sup>, Laura 64<sup>th</sup>, Princess 70<sup>th</sup> and Shaneka in 71<sup>st</sup> position.









In the Under 16 (Year 10 & 11) events our boys' team were placed in 7<sup>th</sup> position overall and produced our best individual performance of the day with Flynn finishing in 9<sup>th</sup> position; followed by Vontai 21<sup>st</sup>, Matt 42<sup>nd</sup>, Henry 54<sup>th</sup> and Harry 55<sup>th</sup>; the Under 16 girls' team – Charlotte, Izzy, Mia and Kenna, finished in 14<sup>th</sup> overall. Well done to all our CCHS team runners, we are very proud of your representation of the school and for an outstanding effort and determination.




















