Alfie displayed an amazing work ethic and attitude to learning; his photography work was creative and highly meaningful.

The final award of the evening was the prestigious 'Clactonian' trophy, presented for outstanding progress, contribution to school and local community and exemplary study skills. This year it was presented to former Year 13 student, Chloe Brugnoli-Khan. During her A-Level studies she overcame numerous challenges and propelled herself through adversity to become a first-generation applicant to higher education. Her strong academic characteristics combined with her relentless pursuit for self-improvement has led her to gaining a Foundation Year in Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences at the University of Cambridge.
