

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## CCHS Ski Team – Tonale, Italy, Easter 2024

On the first day of the Easter holiday, thirty-nine excited Year 10 students, along with five intrepid staff, boarded a luxury coach bound for Italy – 1000 miles drive, over 24 hours, through six countries! The thought of the long drive through the night was softened with the expectations of the great week skiing that lay ahead. Upon arrival, skis, boots and helmets were collected, before students had a chance to settle in to their rooms at Hotel Iscla, which the group took over for the week! Only two students had ever previously experienced a winter holiday, so the first morning on the slopes was, to say the least, interesting, especially as the weather wasn't playing ball, with wet snow all day long dampening the proceedings! Great hilarity ensued with tumbles, uncontrolled backwards skiing and the odd domino effect on lines of waiting skiers. That said, by the end of the day, everybody had spent more time vertical than horizontal and had accomplished a drag-lift or chair lift – some better than others!



Each day the CCHS ski team made a coach journey up the mountain to the main nursery slopes and then back again at the end of the day. This also entailed loading and unloading the coach with over forty pairs of skis, boots and poles; a mammoth task for our fantastic coach drivers, who looked after the group all week. Once everyone had mastered the nursery slopes, the ski groups started to venture further afield, as the ski instructors were able to show their ski groups more of the wonderful ski area, whilst continuing to improve their techniques. Despite being the end of the ski season, there was plenty of snow all week. After the damp start to the week, the sun came out to reveal some stunning views from the Presena Glacier, where the groups enjoyed their final runs of the holiday at a height of 3000m.



As the week progressed, the improvement made from the students' first trepid slips and slides on the first day, was astounding. Many faced their fears, pushed their boundaries and jumped right out of their comfort zone – all of which were rewarded through their accomplishments and the praise and encouragement from the instructors, our teachers and, more importantly, their peers. The week was not without its challenges – from various injuries to a sickness bug that swept through the group, along with other testing situations, including a double break-down on the return journey which resulted in a nine-hour plus delay in arriving home. Despite the set-backs, it was heartening to witness how the entire group enjoyed each other's company throughout the trip – be it on the coach, in the hotel or out on the slopes – they are a great bunch of young people, of whom the teachers on the trip were exceedingly proud. We are sure some lasting friendships and lifelong memories were made by the CCHS Ski Team 2024.
