eScooters - Important Notice to Parents

Please be advised that eScooters, or any form of 'powered transporter', are not permitted on the school site at any time. If a student brings any of these onto the school site parents will be contacted and asked to come and collect the item from school. eScooters must not be ridden on the school site at any time. It is important to note that, under current UK law, it is illegal to use a powered transporter on a public road or in spaces that are set aside for use by pedestrians, cyclists, and horse-riders; this includes on the



pavement and in cycle lanes. Any person who uses a powered transporter on a public road or other prohibited space is in breach of the law and is committing a criminal offence which can be prosecuted.
