Recognising Individuals – Jack Petchey 'Outstanding Achievement' Awards





Coby always Contributes 100% in his lessons and goes above and beyond in everything that he does. He is a role model to others in science lessons, and takes an active lead within practical settings.





Year 10 Futures Week – Experiencing the World of Work

Our Year 10 students spent last week away from their normal lessons to gain an insight into the world of work, which ultimately is what we are all helping prepare them for. The week included numerous workplace visits with a number of providers who hosted groups of students for the day to learn about their industries and see how work places can differ.



Over two days, over 100 students took part in these special work experiences including - **Bartech Marine Engineering** – an engineering company in Colchester that service and maintain engines and power generators across the world; predominately marine based engines in cargo ships and cruise liners but also land based generator sets in Africa. At the **Galloper Windfarm** Headquarters in Harwich students learnt about the off-shore power generation section and talked to staff about the Galloper degree apprenticeship opportunities; there was also an opportunity for them to wear the special rigging harnesses and experience a VR tour of the wind turbines. Whilst at **Rose Builders** students had the opportunity to tour a working building site in Manningtree. During the tour they saw some of the hundreds of new homes in various stages of construction and learnt about the numerous trades required to build a house. **Porsche UK** hosted students at the local Porsche dealership where they learnt about the Porsche organisation, toured the showroom and undertook a number of challenges to discover the diverse cars and the variety of features available. Their hosts were former CCHS students Joe Buckman and Taryn Barella, who spoke to students about their time at CCHS and explained about the career pathway they each followed to lead them into working for Porsche. Other visits included an **NHS experience** at Clacton Hospital, Petro-Chemical organisation, **Halterman Carless** and book printers and distributors, **Penguin Books UK**.



During the week there was also an opportunity for every student to explore other workplaces when they undertook a number of days work-shadowing, to gain a true sense of a work-life experience. We had over two-hundred homeorganised work shadowing experiences which took place during the week, which covered a wide range of careers. Students also engaged with our virtual offer, based on careers advice and employment skills; some completed everything - an experience of work, work shadowing and virtual careers. We are indebted to all the companies who allowed students to visit their workplaces, along with the virtual career placements, including the Met Office and Galloper Windfarms.



In addition, a number of Year 10 students recently spent time at Colchester Institute where they participated in a carousel of activities where they looked at soft skills important to employers like writing emails, communication skills, CVs and learning about the different types of colleges and qualifications.

We hope that the opportunities offered to our Year 10 students during the CCHS Futures Week, has helped them gain a true sense of a work-life experience. As they move into Year 11 we continue to provide a full range of careers education, information, advice, guidance and support, which will be available to help them to make appropriate choices about their post-16 destinations with access to a range of opportunities and exciting events.
