District Athletics 2024



Our top athletes recently represented CCHS at the annual District Athletics meet, competing against schools from across Colchester and North East Essex. A fantastic day of competition resulted in numerous outstanding performances and personal achievements for our fifty competitors. The team had numerous personal best performances with two CCHS athletes winning gold and others having to settle with silver – the first came in the Year 8 Boy's 300m with Jack taking the gold in 41.6 seconds, breaking the same CCHS record that he'd already broken at the Coastal Athletics meet a few weeks ago - that record had stood unbroken since 2015 until Jack took to the track this season! The second gold was collected by Sydnie in the Year 9 Girl's High Jump with a leap of 1.5m – breaking the school record that had stood since 2005 by 3cm - Sydnie then bettered her new record by jumping 1.55m at Sports Day this week. The CCHS team also picked up silver medals from Tom in the Year 10/11 Boy's 200m sprint, followed by our Year 8 Boys' team, who rounded off the day with a stunning race in the 4 x 100m relay. Students from across the school have once again enjoyed our traditional sports days, which are always highly competitive. The Year 7 and 8 sports day, last week, saw both year groups fully participating in various sporting competitions before taking to the athletics track and competing in the field events.

Sparx Reader - Celebrating the Joy of Reading

Our Sparx Reader is our reading platform for Year 7 and Year 8 students and tracks what they are reading. It also monitors how much effort they put into their reading, rewarding them with Sparx Reader Points (SRP) as they read. Students have then been adding additional Reader points



to their totals by correctly answering questions to check their comprehension of what they have read. Throughout this launch year, Year 7 and Year 8 students were tasked to earn at least 600 points (equivalent to 60 minutes of reading) each fortnight, and numerous students have been gaining many more points than this minimum.

This year our students have clocked up some impressive reading statistics - 1,984 hours of careful reading completed, across 265 books, totalling an impressive 11,083,054 words read by our students.

Congratulations to our overall winning English groups this year Miss Harvey's 7x/En1 (pictured above) and Mrs Welham's 8y/En2 where they received a certificate and treat! In September, the competition restarts and increases with our Year 7 students continuing with their weekly reading via Sparx, when they are in Year 8, along with our new Year 7 students, joining us in September.

Start of Summer Holiday on Hold

The start of the Summer break is on hold for Mr Henderson, Key Sage 3 Physical Education Lead, who is taking on a massive challenge next week. He is attempting the 'Goggins 4x4x48' Challenge, named after David Goggins - a retired United States Navy SEAL who is now a ultramarathon runner, ultradistance cyclist and triathlete. Mr Henderson will be running 4 miles, every 4 hours, for 48 hours - starting at 6pm on Tuesday 23rd July, then again at 10pm, 2am, 6am and so on, until the final run at 2pm on Thursday 25th July - this all equates to a total of 48 miles across 12 runs, in 48 hours. He is also considering adding a 13th run at the end - just for luck - to tip the total distance to equate to the distance of two marathons. This ambitious project showcased the talent of so many of the County High kids, who never cease to amaze: from Seth Garner learning to dance, to Tom Isles growing in confidence in his first lead role. It seems so wrong to single any individual out, in a production that was so much about a warm, hard-working, friendly group of people. As always thanks need to go to so many of the staff that support these shows and make the musical at CCHS such a special occasion and it seems unfair to name one. However, without Andy Parsons, Steve Thomas and Nathan Peck, who give up their time and volunteered to make the technical aspects come together, it would not be the same.
