

An Insight into Engineering





A number of our Year 9 students gained an insight into the world of engineering when they attended a special Christmas Lecture at Anglia Ruskin University at the end of last term. The talk was as part of the Chelmsford Science and Engineering Society's annual series of lectures for schools to help stimulate interest in the study of STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). The students enjoyed a talk delivered by Professor Tim Minshall from Cambridge Universities Institute of Manufacturing, entitled 'Your Life is Manufactured' - an engaging presentation on how objects that we encounter during our lives, from common-place objects through to large complex items, such as the Airbus Aircraft and SpaceX rockets, are manufactured, along with how the amazing advances in modern technologies that have allowed for these complex items and machines to be created. At the conclusion of the lecture the students had an opportunity to quiz the professor about engineering, university and his career.
