Year 11 Revision sessions are now fully focused on the upcoming mock exams and the summers exams. ## Year 11 Passport to the Prom

This year's 'Passport to the Prom' was launched at the start of term. The annual initiative provides an incentive to our Year 11 students to attend as many revision sessions as they possibly can and encourage excellent



school attendance in the final push towards their exams. We realise that the Year 11 Prom is an exciting milestone in a student's transition from main school to sixth form and further education. It marks their journey towards adulthood; however, the Prom is not only a celebration of a student's time at Clacton County High School, but also a reward for the effort and hard work put into achieving their absolute best in their exams. Over the course of the next fourteen weeks, up until the 23<sup>rd</sup> May, in order to be eligible to purchase a ticket to their Prom on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> July, our Year 11 students will need to attend, and actively participate in, a minimum of five Maths, five English and five Science revision sessions, along with at least ten revision sessions in other subjects of their choice. In addition, students need to consistently maintain a 95% attendance record or higher through to their summer exams, complete a minimum of three quality homework pieces each week and meet all of their coursework deadlines. As an additional incentive, students who complete thirty-five revision sessions or more, will be entered into a prize draw for some great prizes including; Complimentary Prom Tickets, Hair, Nail and Make-up salon vouchers, Amazon Vouchers and numerous other prizes.



CCHS staff are extremely dedicated; always willing to go the extra mile for their students, they provide after school revision workshops, additional support during holidays and even at weekends, closer to the exams. Students should talk to their subject teachers to find out more details on the times and dates of any additional sessions, as well as consulting the weekly revision timetable available online within our Revision Microsite.

Parental support is so important in ensuring success and we know our parents are equally supportive of the school. Please encourage your child to make the most of the help available to achieve the best possible grades they can.
