Road crashes are the biggest killer of 17 to 25-year-olds in the UK, so in an effort to combat this, the Partnership is educating young people who can then inspire and challenge other young drivers/passengers and help save lives. The presentation, entitled 'Vision Zero', consisted of tips and information ranging from how to obtain a driving



The 'Vision Zero' strategy aims to make our roads in Essex safer by eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all. The scheme was first implemented in Sweden in the 1990s, and has proven successful across Europe and now across the UK, along with making a major impact in American cities.
