All Year 11s will take a mock examination in the core subjects (English, Math and Science) and further mock examinations depending on which subjects they are studying.

Please refer to your child's <u>exam timetable</u> to identify which mocks they will be taking. For Spanish speaking exams, each individual student will be given a specific examination time slot.

Please note that following an afternoon exam your Year 11 child will be sent home, this will mean that those taking the exam will be leaving prior to the normal finish time of 3.10pm. If students are not taking an exam they will attend normal lessons, breaks and lunches and finish at the normal time.
