EASTER GREETINGS FROM CHRIS TAYLOR, HEAD OF SCHOOL

We have had a very busy and exciting half term since February and when we return on Monday, 15th April at 8.45am, we will be officially entering our final full term; the summer term!

To all of our families, as ever thank you for all of your support and the many kind words of thanks that we receive from you, these are always much appreciated. I would like to formally thank all of our CCHS staff for their dedication and commitment to your children, both academically and all the extra-curricular clubs, events and trips, especially those colleagues who give up their family time in the evenings and at weekends.

At the end of each term, when I write to you, I always like to add a safeguarding reminder. I cannot emphasise enough how important it is that we look out for our children during school holiday times. Young people need independence and freedoms as they grow and develop, peer groups often become their main priority as they grow resilience, but please ensure you know where your child is and who they are interacting with. This could be when they are out and about in the community or online. My advice is never be afraid to check, young people can be very private, but through sharing and engaging in dialogue, it opens lines of communication and can often prevent any upset or distress. There are some great apps to enable parents to know where their child is.

A couple of reminders for our return, please ensure your child is in correct full uniform, including no false nails, eyelashes removed, natural coloured hair and no facial piercings. If you need any support with uniform items please contact the school who will direct this to the relevant pastoral team. Also, students MUST bring a water bottle to school as cups will no longer be available. We have lots of bottle filling stations around school as well as a water fountain in L block for those who forget their bottle.

We are wishing all of our families an enjoyable two-week break with, hopefully, some sunny spring weather and wish you all a very Happy Easter, stay well and enjoy some time with family and friends.

Water Bottles required from Easter
