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Whole School Notices

Parking at CCHS

We kindly remind all parents and carers that <u>students should not be driven into the</u> school car park for drop off or collection at the start and end of the school day.

In addition to this, for safety reasons, we have yellow ZIGZAG lines at the front of school, in Walton Road. Stopping on the zigzags prevents others from having a clear view of the road and prevents pedestrians from crossing safely. These lines are clearly visible to all, as are several time plates displaying the times when it makes it an offence to park, stop or drop-off on these lines. The plates are prominently placed, showing the clearway symbol and state "No stopping" and the times to which this relates. There is no parking or stopping Monday to Friday between 8.15am and 9.15am and again between 2.45pm and 3.45pm - This includes stopping in the middle of the road or directly across from the school entrance.



Anybody seen to stop and drop off on the yellow zigzags during these times, will not only be putting other students' lives at risk, but they will also risk being issued with a fixed penalty notice. We appreciate it is not always easy finding a suitable space to park around school, but we ask that you park with consideration for our neighbours in all the roads that surround the school and not on any grass verges which are privately owned. A much more

suitable place to drop off and pick up is the large Leisure Centre car park. Please do not park in the top section of the car park immediately outside the Leisure Centre itself; there is ample parking in the first sections of the car park. Thank you for your cooperation, helping us ensure the safety of our students and to help reduce the inconvenience of our neighbours.
