Whole School Notices

Uniform Reminders: Colder Weather and Expectations

As the weather cools, please be reminded of the specific items permitted as part of our uniform to ensure your child stays warm while adhering to school rules.

Colder Weather Uniform

If your child chooses to wear a jumper to school, it must be only one of the following:

- 1. The official school jumper or cardigan
- 2. A plain navy (not black) V-neck knitted jumper

Important: items of clothing that are not part of the official school uniform, such as coats, jackets and hoodies, must be removed and must not be worn inside the school building under any circumstance.

We appreciate your support in ensuring your child follows the uniform rules.

Following these guidelines helps ensure your child encounters only positive attention from staff.

Trousers and Leggings

Please be reminded that students should not be wearing leggings to school. Leggings are not a permitted item of uniform.

Students are expected to wear acceptable trousers, which can be viewed in the acceptable uniform document here. Students found wearing leggings or other non-uniform items will be given the correct uniform to change into. Refusal to follow uniform expectations may lead to sanctions.

Skirts and Shorts

The following options are acceptable alternatives to trousers:

- Royal Blue pleated skirt: These must be worn at the purchased length and must not be rolled over at the top.
- CCHS (branded) tailored shorts.

When wearing a skirt, only the following hosiery is permitted:

- Plain black tights.
- Plain navy, black, or white ankle or knee-high socks.

Leggings are not acceptable in place of tights.

Thank you for your cooperation in maintaining our school's standards and ensuring all students are correctly dressed.

Dropping Off Forgotten Items and Student Responsibility

For parents/carers who wish to drop off items their child has forgotten for the school day, please note the following collection procedure.

Collecting Forgotten Items

We recommend that you agree with your child at home that if something is forgotten, it is their responsibility to check at reception to see if you have delivered it. Students can check for forgotten items during the following designated times:

Before Registration	08.00 - 08.45	
5 minute lesson changeovers	09.00 - 09.05	10.20 - 10.25
Breaktime	11.40 - 12.05	
Lunchtime	13.20 - 14.00	
After school	15.15 - 16.15	

Important to note: Unless there is a specific, isolated emergency, reception staff will not deliver forgotten items to students or pass messages.

Fostering Student Responsibility

A key part of secondary school is for students to learn to handle the responsibility of bringing everything they need for the day, including items for after-school activities. If your child forgets an item, we encourage you to consider letting them learn from the experience. Having to deal with the consequences of forgetting something provides a powerful incentive for them to take more responsibility next time.

Messages for Students

We ask parents and carers to ensure their child has received all information regarding after-school arrangements before leaving for school in the morning. These include:

- Expected attendance at after-school clubs
- Pick up arrangements
- Where to go/who to meet after school

Please make a general arrangement with your child to switch on their phone after school to check for any messages and/or to follow your clear after-school instructions. If your child has SEN requirements, you may wish to discuss these arrangements with your inclusion support worker.
