Year 8 Revision – Students should visit the school's **Revision Microsite** for all the revision material for the Year 8 Assessments – they must be signed into their school Google account to access the revision material.

Year 8 - Continued

Why are assessments important and what are they used for?

- 1. **Tracking Progress:** They help teachers, students, and parents understand how well a student is progressing through Key Stage 3 (Years 7–9). This informs whether students are on track or need additional support.
- 2. **Setting Targets**: Results from Year 8 assessments often influence target-setting for Year 9 and may even play a role in early decisions about GCSE subject options.
- 3. **Identifying Strengths and Weaknesses:** They highlight areas where a student is doing well and where improvement is needed, allowing for more tailored teaching.
- 4. **Building Exam Skills:** Regular assessments help students become familiar with formal testing environments and build skills like time management, revision strategies, and resilience.
- 5. **School Performance Monitoring:** Schools use Year 8 data to monitor the effectiveness of their curriculum and teaching methods, which can influence internal planning and resource allocation.

Year 10

Year 10 Mock examinations will start w/c Monday, 2nd June

Mock exams replicate exam conditions, providing a glimpse into the pressure, time constraints and atmosphere of the actual GCSEs. Mocks won't affect final GCSE scores but they are still important because they identify areas of the subject students may need to work on. They are an excellent self-awareness tool for students as well as giving teachers a clearer idea of where students are in their learning.

Year 10 Futures week - Includes work experience/shadowing and Career interviews

- Your child's work experience arrangements must be recorded on this <u>Booking form</u>
- Pre-interview information must be recorded <u>here</u>

From **Tuesday 1**st **July to Thursday 3**rd **July**, all Year 10 students are expected to be engaged in a work experience placement and will not attend school. Students can attend a place of work with a parent, family member, or another responsible adult (with parental consent). This workplace experience (Work Shadowing) aims to provide insight into the world of work. Once a placement has been found for your child please complete the work placement consent form above (Booking form) *Please note: students attending agreed placements in childcare do not need to complete the form.*

If your child is unable to secure a placement with a family member or friend, they will participate in a series of workplace visits, alongside virtual experiences, coordinated by CCHS staff.

Year 10 career interviews

Students will receive a one-on-one interview with a career's advisor to help them explore future career options based on their interests, skills, and qualifications.

When is my child's interview?

Students are kindly requested to complete the questionnaire found here, after which an appointment day and time will be allocated

Please encourage your child to prepare by considering the following five key steps, which will be discussed during the interview:

- 1. Interests and Strengths What subjects or activities do you enjoy and excel in?
- 2. Career Aspirations What jobs or industries interest you?
- 3. Qualifications and Skills What qualifications do you need for your chosen career?
- 4. **Post-16 Pathways** Do you want to pursue A-levels, vocational courses, an apprenticeship, or another route?
- 5. **Action Plan** What are your next steps to achieve your goals?

Taking time to reflect on these points will help ensure a productive and meaningful discussion about their future.

Exam contingency days - Wednesday, 25th June 2025

Some of our families will be hoping to plan and book holidays for summer 2025, however, it is important to note that Wednesday, 25th June 2025 is a contingency day set by Ofqual. This means that all exam candidates must be available to sit exams from the date of their first exam until, and including Wednesday, 25th June 2025. This decision is not a school decision and does apply to all candidates, in all schools, we thank you for your understanding. Contingency days are designed to be used in the event of national or significant local disruption to examinations

Year 11 attendance in the exam period

Up to and including Friday, 6th June

Students are expected to attend normal lessons if not in revision or an exam up to and including Friday, 6th June. If they have finished a subject (exam has been taken), they will need to bring in revision materials to revise independently for upcoming exams in the normal lesson time.

From Monday, 9th June - Study Leave

Students are expected to be in school for pre-exam revision and exams only. This is known as Study Leave.

- Pencil
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Highlighter pen for subjects such as English, history, geography, RE
- Scientific calculator for maths, science, and geography papers

If your child has trouble sourcing any of this equipment, including a calculator, please let the school know as soon as possible so that one can be made available. A Scientific calculator is a vital piece of equipment for maths and physics exams. If your child doesn't have one or forgets to bring one they should speak with their teacher.
