PSHE and RSHE lessons are essential for helping young people navigate the complexities of modern life, supporting their safety, well-being, and future success both personally and professionally. Key factors include:

Promoting Mental and Physical Health

- Teaching students how to manage stress, emotions, and relationships.
- Providing knowledge about healthy lifestyles, including diet, exercise, and substance awareness.
- Encouraging early help-seeking behaviour and reducing stigma around mental health.

Building Healthy Relationships

- RSHE helps students understand consent, respect, and boundaries.
- Teaching about different types of relationships (including friendships, family, and romantic).
- Supporting development of empathy, communication skills, and conflict resolution

Keeping Children Safe

- Educating about online safety, grooming, peer pressure, and exploitation.
- Helping children recognize unsafe situations and understand how to seek help.
- Raising awareness of their rights and how to protect themselves.

Developing Life Skills

- Teaching critical thinking, decision-making, resilience, and self-awareness.
- Preparing students for adult responsibilities such as managing money, careers, and independence.
- Encouraging responsible citizenship and social awareness


Promoting Inclusion and Equality

- PSHE and RSHE tackles stereotypes, discrimination, and prejudice.
- Helping students understand and respect diversity in culture, gender identity, sexuality, and family structure.
