Uniform in warmer weather

Are you a Military Service Family?

The Department for Education (DfE) introduced the Service Pupil Premium (SPP) in April 2011 in recognition of the specific challenges children from service families face and as part of the commitment to delivering the Armed Forces Covenant.

State schools, academies, and free schools in England that have children of service families in school years Reception to Year 11 can receive the SPP funding. It is designed to assist the school in providing the additional support that these children may need.

Therefore, if your child is eligible, please can you confirm your service status by contacting us on 01255 424266 or emailing admin@cchs.school

'Pupils are eligible for SPP if they meet one of the following criteria:

- One of their parents is serving in the regular armed forces (including pupils with a parent who is on full commitment as part of the full-time reserve service).
- They have been registered as a 'service child' on a school census in the past 6 years (see below the 'DfE's ever 6 service child measure').
- One of their parents died while serving in the armed forces and the pupil receives a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme or the War Pensions Scheme.
- One of their parents is in the armed forces of another nation and is stationed in England.

We also have the Ever 6 measure for service children so any Ex-service personnel that left the service within the last 6 years should also let us know as they will also be eligible for the extra funding.

Important to record – Student First Language

CCHS is proud to have a diverse and multicultural student population and recognise that many of our students will use more than one language. The DfE requires us as a school to collect information regarding the first language of our students. This information should be recorded on the Arbor app which can be done by navigating to the Student profile, and clicking on 'Add information', and 'Add Another Spoken Language'. Please ensure you tick 'First language'. Alternatively, you can email the data team on datateam@cchs.school to inform us of your child's first language.

Importantly; The DfE defines a student's first language as being 'where the pupil has been exposed to a language other than English during early development and continues to be exposed to this language in the home or in the community'.

Adjusted timings of the school day

From Monday 23rd June, we will be trialling different timings within the school day. The day will still start at 8:45 and finish at 3:15pm with 4 x 1hr 15min lessons plus tutor time. Students have stated that the 5min changeover is sometimes a bit rushed if they want to use the toilet, fill up a water bottle, and get across the school. As a result, we will be trialling a single break with a 10 min changeover when two lessons are next to each other. This will allow time to get to the toilet (if necessary), fill up water bottles and get across the school to a different lesson. I am sure you will agree that students should all be able to manage 1hr 15mins in class without any need for disturbance.

Important Water Safety Message – Drowning Prevention Week

This week was 'Drowning Prevention Week', the annual National Water Safety Awareness campaign promoted by the Royal Life Saving Society. Their aim is to reduce the number of drowning and near-drowning incidents that occur in the UK every year by showing people how to be safe near water. In the UK, accidental drowning causes more than 400 deaths every year, and many more lives are affected by near-drowning. Drowning is the third-highest cause of death in children and teenagers and claims the lives of nearly half a million people worldwide each year. Knowing how to stay safe when you are on, in, or near water is extremely important, especially as we live on the coast. Every year the Coastguard, the Lifeboat, and the local Beach Patrol deal with numerous incidents, which could have easily been avoided had those involved known how to stay safe around water.



Remembering some basic tips can ensure you, your family, and the people around you are kept safe near water this summer:

- If you find yourself struggling in the water unexpectedly, your instincts tell you to swim hard. But cold-water shock could make you gasp uncontrollably and breathe in water – instead 'Float to Live'.
Tilt your head back with ears submerged; Relax and try to breathe normally; Move your hands to help you stay afloat; It's OK if your legs sink, we all float differently; Spread your arms and legs to improve stability
- Don't use inflatable toys or boats on open water unless they are tethered with a rope to the bank or beach.
- Don't PLAY on or SWIM around breakwaters or the rock 'fishtail' sea defences on Clacton beach. These are usually covered in slippery seaweed and strong currents around such structures can easily pull even strong swimmers underwater.
- Children and adults need to know not to enter the water if someone else is in danger. Throwing a buoyant aid, using a stick, a piece of clothing or whatever is at hand is the safest way to help rescue a conscious person.
- If you see someone in trouble, stay calm and try shouting for help. If no one comes and you cannot reach the person, call the emergency services.

gives practical, accessible, and affordable support to parents and professionals who support children and teenagers. The school currently subscribes to ensure CCHS parents can access these talks for free.

How to access

To access the provision, you will need a CCHS code. On Wednesday, 30th April, you should have received an email from Mr Taylor introducing **FACE** (Family Advice-Communication-Education) parent talks which included the code. If you did not receive the email, please contact us via admin@cchs.school

This code grants all CCHS parents and staff unlimited access to all FACE Parent Talks (usually £24 each) for 12 months (up to Jan 2026 for our school).

The talks are on a four-week rotation and are available as morning sessions (10:00-11:30) and evening sessions (19:00-20:30).

The code cannot be used for any other FACE services or shared with parents or staff from another school.

How to Use the Code:

Visit the PARENTS page of the FACE website (facefamilyadvice.co.uk) to view the 16 regular talks for parents. Click through the booking calendar to find a date and time that suits you.

At the payment stage of booking, enter the code where it says ADD PROMO CODE. This will reduce the price from £24 to £0.
