# Mock Results - Friday, 18th July 2025

On Friday, 18<sup>th</sup> July, Year 10 students will receive their mock exam results in a dedicated "results envelope". This is a significant day, as it provides an early indication of their academic progress and offers valuable insights for their future educational paths. Beyond their mock exam grades, students will also receive their most recent school report. This will contain their professional predicted grade (PPG). The PPG is the grade teachers believe students are on track to achieve if they maintain their current work ethic and progress. The report will also include their descriptors outlining the student's attitude to learning (AtL). To support continuous improvement, the report will highlight specific areas of strength and an area identified for further development. A key benefit of receiving these results and the PPG at this stage is the ability to use them for early applications to post-16 colleges.

If students are disappointed with their PPG, there is still ample time to improve. The two most impactful things they can do right now is to:

- 1) **Prioritise Attendance and Engagement** Attending every lesson, everyday is non-negotiable. Listening and "Opting-in" means students are actively engaging and applying themselves to the best of their ability. Attendance plays a key part in achievement and this is evidenced clearly in section 4.3 of the <u>attached government report</u> published in March this year.
- 2) **Start Revision and Independent Study Early** Read through year 10 work over the summer. Students are encouraged to start small and gradually build up study time. Support on 'how and what' to revise can be found on our <u>website</u> and students should always talk to their teachers for advice and guidance. Exam preparation and a focus on their future goals and aspirations will make a difference. Remember "Hard work always pays off".

# E- Scooters Safety and the Law

As part of our ongoing commitment to student safety, we're reminding everyone about the rules and laws surrounding electric scooters. Electric scooters are not permitted on school grounds and should not be used by students traveling to or from school.

It is crucial for all families to understand that privately-owned e-scooters are illegal for anyone of any age to ride in any public place (such as roads, cycle tracks, parks).

We have been asked by <u>Safer Essex Roads</u> to share with our families the risks associated with allowing children to use any type of e-scooter and make them aware of the laws surrounding it. The use of these scooters by children is unfortunately leading to serious injuries and, in some tragic cases, fatalities.

With the summer break approaching, those unaware of the law, or the risks to their children, may be considering buying one as a gift. Unfortunately, it is not illegal to buy one and the shops and on-line outlets do not make it clear enough that they may only be used on privately owned land.

The key points are that:

- 1. Privately owned e-scooters (most of which are plain black) are illegal for anyone of any age to ride in any public place. E-scooters you can buy from shops like Halfords and Smyths or online can only be used on privately owned land, with the landowner's permission.
- 2. Parents providing an e-scooter for their child are putting them at risk on the roads. Children are unlikely to be aware of the Highway Code, wear helmets or anything to make them visible to other road users, or have the necessary observation skills. Carrying passengers also makes the scooter unstable. Travelling at speeds of 15 mph, there's a high likelihood of being seriously injured if they fall off or are involved in a collision.

To ensure compliance with both school policy and the law, we kindly request that parents/carers prevent their children from using electric scooters to travel to school. Students found bringing or using electric scooters on school property may have them confiscated.

We appreciate your cooperation in reinforcing these guidelines with your child and supporting our shared goal of maintaining a safe and secure school environment.
