Free School Meal Vouchers

We have been advised by Essex County Council that the supplier account through which the school issues supermarket vouchers has been affected by a phishing scam.

As a precautionary measure the Council have had to freeze all school accounts to prevent fraud. Whilst CCHS has issued all its vouchers, some may not be accessible. The Council is working with the voucher supplier to find a quick solution. We realise that with the holidays upon us the timing of this situation is not ideal, but we will be liaising with the Council and as soon as we receive instructions from them we will act to ensure you receive and can access your voucher as soon as possible. Please keep an eye out for further communications.

CCHS School Uniform 2025/2026



The CCHS school uniform is fundamental to our identity and standing within the community. Importantly, wearing a school uniform helps students focus on their education by promoting a distraction-free environment. It can also help reduce anxiety about appearance and promote self-confidence through a feeling of belonging.

Everything you need to know about CCHS uniform expectations can be found via the school's website which you can access <u>here</u>. We have included picture guides on acceptable trousers and shoes and details on rules regarding hair, makeup, false eyelashes, and fingernails.

We understand that not all families are in a position to afford a school uniform. With this in mind, we have limited the number of school-branded items, these include the blazer, tie, and PE rugby shirt / PE sweatshirt. Branded items can be purchased from our uniform supplier Anglia Sports and Schoolwear Ltd. All other items can be obtained from regular clothing outlets. Staying safe around water

We are lucky enough to live close to the sea and when the weather is good, many of us head to the beach, especially young people who use the area to meet and be with friends. Please encourage your child to use beaches patrolled with a full-time lifeguard, advise them to be wary of swimming out of their depth and the use of inflatables with the risk of drifting out to sea. Ask them to heed the warning signs about jumping off rocks etc, they are there for a reason. Very importantly locally – not to swim close to or under Clacton pier the currents here are very dangerous.

General Safety Tips:

Supervision

Never leave children unattended near water, even for a moment, <u>Essex County Fire and Rescue Service</u> and <u>Essex Safeguarding Children Board.</u> Drowning can occur quickly and silently.

Never Swim Alone

Always swim with a buddy, especially in open water, **Essex Safeguarding Children Board.**

Be Water Aware

Pay attention to local warning signs and flags, and check the safety arrangements of any water-based activities, **Essex County Fire and Rescue Service.**

Alcohol and Water

Never enter the water after drinking alcohol, as it impairs judgment and swimming ability, **Essex County Fire and Rescue Service.**

Tides and Currents

At the beach, be aware of tides and potential rip currents, Essex County Fire and Rescue Service

Emergency

If you find yourself unexpectedly in the water, don't panic. Extend your arms and legs and float on your back until the effects of cold-water shock pass. Never enter the water to try and rescue someone; call 999 and ask for the Fire Service if inland or the Coastguard if at the coast.

Mock results, reports, reflections and moving forward

Today, your child collected their "mock examination results envelope." Immediately following this, they were asked to complete a Google Form designed to encourage reflection on their results, their report, their preparation for these mocks, and what steps they can take to improve moving forward. A copy of their completed form will be automatically emailed to them for their reference.

Our staff have already commenced providing personalised feedback and are adapting learning to address weaker areas, and will continue to do so throughout Year 11. We firmly believe that, along with attending every lesson and opting in, a key part of academic success is having strong motivation to achieve, together with effective independent revision.

As a parent, your support is invaluable in guiding your child through this important period. Here are some ways you can assist your child to help them prepare for and navigate Year 11;

During the holidays:

- Make time to sit down with your child and discuss their responses on the Google Form. If your child
 did not complete the <u>form</u>, ask them to log into their Google account and complete it.
- Discuss with them their next steps in order to motivate them and visit open days/evenings for post-16 providers to show them the opportunities available. Our Sigma Sixth event is on Thursday 9th October 2025.
- Encourage and support independent revision at home. Your child has access to a
 dedicated website via their Google accounts, which provides valuable resources. A good starting
 point would be to help them create a revision timetable focusing on their top three priority subjects,
 as identified in their Google Form reflection.

From September:

- Ensure they attend school and their lessons every day as attendance matters
- Encourage them to attend after school revision sessions which start the week commencing 8th September a timetable will be sent out in September.
- We invite you to attend our parents' evening with your child which is on Thursday 2nd October 2025.
