Working with our Parents and Carers

One of the best resources we have as a school is the knowledge, wisdom, and support of our parents and carers. We must work collaboratively to maximise the academic and pastoral outcomes of our students focusing on the positives and handling any difficulties together. Focusing on positives includes our students opting in to gain PROUD points. Many of our students are doing exceptionally well at this. Students receive PROUD+ points for going 'over and above' in lessons. These points accrue throughout the term and at the end of the term students can spend them in our virtual shop. In addition to the Proud+ points, your child will collect PROUD points for attending and opting into lessons and registration (form time). These points, together with attendance scores, can result in an invitation to attend end-of-term reward trips (2 negative points or more, in a term, will mean that your child misses out on this opportunity) Your child's PROUD points and PROUD+ points can be viewed on [Arbor](#) (our Parent Portal). If you haven't already done so, please take a look at your child's progress and continue to support them in making good decisions in terms of behaviour and opting into lessons. Work Shadowing involves students attending a place of work with either a parent, another family member, or another responsible adult to help them gain a true sense of a work-life experience.
